Breed: West Highland White Terrier

Origin: Poltalloch, Scotland

History: Originally known as the Poltalloch Terrier and was at times referred to as the Roseneath Terrier, after the Duke of Argyll's estate. The Malcolm family bred its white coat to be easily visible on the Scottish Moors. It was introduced to the United States in 1906 under the Roseneath name but then changed to the West Highland White Terrier in 1909.

Size: Weight: 15 lbs. to 22 lbs.
Height: 10" to 11"

Coat: A double coat of straight hard white hair about 2 inches long with a shorter coat on neck and shoulders. This hard outer coat may have wheaten tipping. The stiff outer coat needs daily grooming with a brush to maintain a proper appearance.

Color: White

Temperament: The West Highland is alert and self-reliant but friendly. A good companion and gets along well with older children.
